ABOUT THE PLAY:

King Richard II is corrupted by his inner circle; lavish living has depleted his funds. Upon opening of the play, we find out that Richard's uncle, the Duke of Gloucester, has been murdered. Henry Bolingbroke accuses Thomas Mowbray of the Duke's murder, and a date for their trial by combat is appointed. Their duel is suddenly interrupted by King Richard; he banishes Bolingbroke and Mowbray from England. With his cousin Bolingbroke out of the picture, Richard usurps the estate of his late uncle, John of Gaunt. Outraged by this injustice and aided by a group of nobles, Bolingbroke returns to claim his birthright. Richard is formally deposed, relinquishing the crown to Henry Bolingbroke, now King Henry IV. A plot against King Henry's life makes the York family choose sides, while another group of nobles plot the murder of the imprisoned Richard.

Richard II is a play about challenging power and the changing times. It calls to the carpet a corrupt leader and calls to service a new administration and a hopeful new era. Our production explores a radical change between the past and the future; like a face in a mirror, we look forward and backwards all at once.
